Justification for 1:1 Initiative

- To provide students access to high quality digital resources
- To help students be better organized and **meet learning goals**
- To apply technology skills that will prepare them for work and college
- To provide equal **access for all students** in our district

About the Dell Latitude 3150:

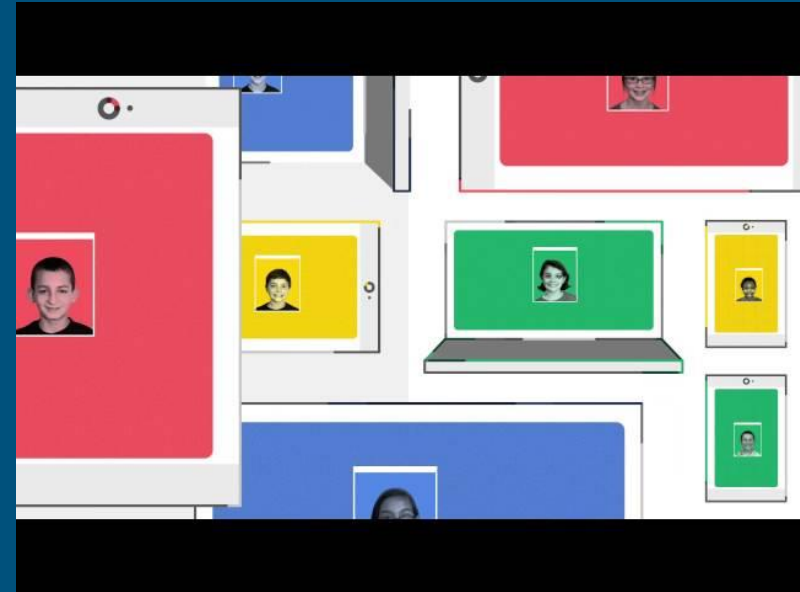
- It's a notebook with **Battery Running Time of 10 hours**

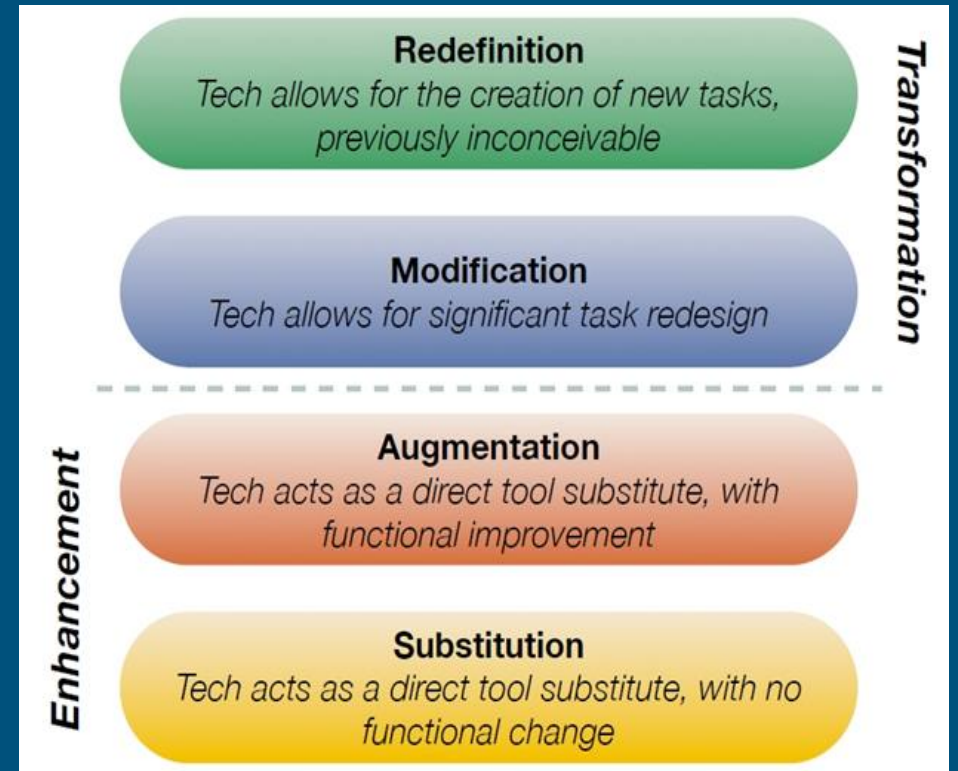

What will students receive?

- **Items assigned to student for entire school year and returned for summer maintenance**
 - Dell Latitude laptop & power adapter
 - **Protective sleeve** to be used to protect the computer. The case does not need to be removed--students can work on the laptop while keeping the sleeve on.
- **Daily Responsibilities**
 - Students should come each day with a **fully-charged device**.
 - **“Close it, Move it”** - students are expected to close the laptop before moving it.

Acceptable Use Policy



- This policy explains how students must:
 - Respect and protect their own privacy and the privacy of others.
 - Respect and protect the integrity, availability, and security of all electronic resources.
 - Respect and protect the copyrighted/intellectual property of others.
 - Respect and practice the principles of community.
- Additional information regarding responsible use will be available on the district website.
- Students will receive this information during an in-school presentation. No laptop will be given until a signature and user fee are obtained.

Financial Information

- An annual fee of \$20.00 will be required at the day of pickup.
- Additional fees for missing or damaged parts can be found in the 1:1 Technology Guidelines Handbook or on the 1:1 website.
- To summarize:
 - Charger lost or destroyed \$10
 - Carrying Case lost or destroyed \$20
 - Dell Latitude lost \$250 (\$100 with police report)
 - Dell Latitude destroyed \$250

The Anti-Big Brother Act

The Dell Latitude laptops are equipped with webcams.

The Glassboro Public School District will NEVER use this feature in a manner that would violate the privacy rights of the student or any individual residing with the student.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

The school board approved plan also allows for families to provide their own device for students.

- Student must bring their own device to school fully charged every day.
- Must be able to **access Google Apps and have Google Chrome browser.**
- The district has **no liability or responsibility** for configuring, repairing or replacing the BYOD device.
