

Investments in Education

PARCC Testing - \$45,000

Transportation for Extended School Day Program at Bowe - \$2,000

3 Independent Classroom Libraries at Rodgers - \$7,500

3 new part-time Aides at Bullock for 3 hours/day - \$25,000








Glassboro Public Schools 2014-2015 Budget Revenue




Glassboro Public Schools **2014-2015 Appropriations** Salaries & Benefits





Examples:

 Leases/Lease Payments -(Copiers/Printers, TV Studio, Bus, Technology Equipment)

Factors Impacting Tax Rate

- Borough ratables
 dropped by \$11,587,447 =
 \$0.0125
- This added \$25 to average tax bill (1 penny = \$20 to average tax payer)
- This would have required an additional \$300,000 in cuts to staff and programs



2014-2015 Analysis of Tax Impact: Balancing Programming with Taxpayer Needs

4³/₄ Cent Tax Increase

\$89.37 for the average-assessed home in Glassboro (\$187,567)

That is \$7.45 per month
