NJGPA Overview (1 of 2)



- Statute requires the State graduation proficiency assessment to **administered to all grade 11 students.** (N.J.S.A. 18A:7C-6)
- NJGPA is designed to measure the extent to which students are graduation ready in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.
- The ELA component is aligned to the grade 10 standards.
- The Mathematics component is aligned to Algebra I and Geometry standards.





NJGPA Overview (2 of 2)



- Students who take but do not meet the minimum required score on each component of the assessment will have the opportunity to receive additional supports and may take the following steps:
 - Retake the ELA and/or mathematics components of the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment in the following summer or fall
 - Meet a designated cut score from the menu of substitute competency tests
 - Complete a portfolio appeal.

Comparison of Glassboro's Spring 2024 NJGPA Administration – Percentages to NJ

Intervention Strategies



- This year our Intervention classes focused on the 45 seniors who had not met the NJ graduation requirements. This group of seniors took the NJGPA, PSAT, and were encouraged to take the SAT and ACT to have all opportunities to meet the requirements. Students who did not meet those requirements then participate in the Portfolio Appeals Process under the supervision of Mrs. Rynkiewicz and Mrs. George.
- Intervention focus then shifts to juniors who take the NJGPA in March and freshman who take the NJSLA in May.
