#### B. Title I - Basic Skills Improvement Program

Amy Masso-Ferrer: Supervisor of Basic Skills

The Summer Enrichment Program took place at Dorothy L Bullock School for students in grades K-5 and Thomas E Bowe School for students in grades 6-8 from July 8 to August 1, Monday through Thursday from 8:30-11:30am. A total of 163 students were enrolled: 117 in grades K to 5 and 46 in grades 6-8. The program was open to all students in grades K-5 with priority placements given to those who were identified as eligible for basic skills and ESL services. Students in grades 6-8 were identified through MAP, end of year subject area grades, and attendance. Students were instructed at their individual levels based on end of the year MAP assessment data in the areas of ELA and Math and end of year grades from their classroom teachers. Students also received STEM lessons in grades K-5 and Social Studies, Science, and Study Skills in grades 6-8. Teachers utilized the Eureka Math program, skills-based literacy lessons for each grade level, and the Fundations or UFLI phonics curriculum for students in grades K-2. Lessons were delivered utilizing multiple means including whole group and hands-on tasks and assessments. Teachers were able to not only ensure students were maintaining their skill levels, but also provided opportunities for enrichment. Classes in grades K-5 were split between two teachers allowing teachers to work in small groups in content area skills. Students in grades 6-8 were instructed by teachers with content area specializations. A select number of students received individual daily intensive Orton Gillingham lessons and ESL students received enrichment through small group pull-out instruction. End of year 2023-24 MAP data will be compared to beginning of year 2024-25 MAP data to determine the impact the program had on reducing the summer slide in skills. The program had an above average attendance rate for 95% of students in all grades. Teachers and administration were in contact with the parents of students with attendance concerns after the first week to encourage them to attend. A handful of students missed days due to vacations or health related issues. All students were offered district transportation with a few opting to drop off and pick up their students each day.
