• **February 7 In-Service** — The early dismissal In-service day provided an opportunity for grade level/content area PLCs to meet to examine and discuss MAP Winter Benchmark data for the grade level. PLCs had an opportunity to begin to discuss strategies to meet the needs of students evident from MAP data.

# **INSTRUCTION/STUDENT NOTES:**

- January 2022 Bulldogs of Character The Thomas E. Bowe School is proud to highlight on a monthly basis those students who routinely demonstrate high character. We do so through our Bulldog of Character Awards program. The Bulldog of Character Award recognizes one student per grade level each month, as well as one student chosen by our special area teachers (i.e. art, PE, computers, SEL & music), for being outstanding students and citizens and for demonstrating the six pillars of character: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship. - Renaissance Celebration The Thomas E. Bowe School successfully conducted a Renaissance Celebration on Friday, January 21<sup>st</sup> to celebrate students who achieved the criteria during the 1<sup>st</sup> marking period making the eligible to participate in the program. It was planned by advisors Ms. Dana Maiorini and Ms. Taylor Machulsky. The program included gift card raffles throughout the day for eligible students.
- MAP Testing The Bowe School administered the MAP Winter Benchmark for both ELA & math during the weeks of January 17<sup>th</sup> and January 24<sup>th</sup>. MAP is a norm-referenced assessment that has a proven track record of providing rich and valuable student data to schools throughout the world. The MAP Growth assessments our students complete at regular intervals throughout the year provide valuable information about what our students know and what they are ready to learn next. On February

- 7<sup>th</sup>, Bowe PLCs and the Bowe administrative team met to analyze and discuss the data as well as begin to formulate a plan for subsequent instruction designed to meet the student needs identified through these assessments.
- Bowe School's Bulldog Boutique Now Open In the effort to continuously support our Bowe School family and community, we are proud to announce the opening of our Bulldog Boutique. The Bulldog Boutique provides students with an opportunity to "shop" for new and gently used clothing and accessories to fit their needs. All items are free, and the shopping experience is private and confidential. Parents/guardians can set up a shopping trip for their child, or donate items, by contacting Dr. Light or their child's homeroom teacher. Now, more than ever it is important for our school and community to work together to best support our students and families.
- Student Presentation on Tuesday, January 18 Mrs. Kerr and Mr. Stephenson delivered a virtual presentation to all grade levels on January 18 in which they reviewed student conduct expectations. Our return to in-person instruction following a long stretch away from the building provided an appropriate time to review these expectations. Included is the expectation that students remove their hoods when in the building. Additionally, it is the expectation that students do not have phones out and visible at any time during the school day and while in the building or on school grounds. These are examples of rules and regulations in place with safety & security of all in mind. We thank parents/guardians for their support of our efforts to keep our learning environment safe and effective.
- Presentation To Grade 6 Students on Wednesday, January 19 We are in the process of planning our year-end activities for our students, which include a day-long fun-filled program for our 6<sup>th</sup> graders that will be held at a campground. For students to earn the privilege of attending this trip, they must adhere to specific student conduct expectations that Mrs. Kerr and Mr. Stephenson outlined during a presentation on the morning of January 19th. The criteria presented also applies to an end-of-year 6<sup>th</sup> Grade D.A.R.E. dance. The presentation is available on the Bowe website for parents/guardians to review.
- **D.A.R.E.** The D.A.R.E. program has officially returned to Bowe. In 6th grade, all students are given the opportunity to participate in D.A.R.E. "D.A.R.E. is a police officer-led series of classroom lessons that teaches children from kindergarten through 12th grade how to resist peer pressure and live productive drug and violence-free lives" (<a href="www.dare.org">www.dare.org</a>). After successfully completing the program, students will participate in a graduation ceremony & be invited to attend the D.A.R.E. dance (provided they meet student conduct criteria). Lt. Timothy Brown and Ptl. Nick Whelan of the Glassboro PD are the primary instructors.
