STAFF NOTES:

• MAP Data Meetings in March – During the month of March, individual data meetings were conducted at Bowe with a focus on student progress as measured by MAP Winter Benchmark data. Teachers were provided with guiding questions to prepare them for individual meetings with Mr. Stephenson to discuss class and individual student data and strategies to provide targeted supports. The meetings were quite productive revealing success stories as well as students in need of additional supports. Thank you to our staff for all the work they did to prepare for the meetings and to develop strategies to assist further growth of students.

- Safety & Security In March, Bowe School conducted a fire drill and a security drill as per NJ State Law 18A:41-1 (the drilling law).
- NJDOE: OSP&EP Webinar "School Security Drill Law Update" (3/3/22) Mr. Stephenson attended a webinar conducted by the NJ OSP&EP on 3/3/22 to review updates to the NJ Drilling Law. The updates revolve primarily around the distinction between drills and exercises and the responsibility of schools to conduct drills in a manner that is sensitive to the age of students and is trauma informed. The goal is to reduce anxiety of all participants and stakeholders as much as possible while ensuring that we are as prepared as possible for a variety of safety & security scenarios. The information was turnkeyed by Mr. Stephenson at admin council and the GPSD Safety & Security Meeting.
- Emergency Operations Demo @ GC Office of Emergency Management Mr. Stephenson, as the GPSD School Safety Specialist, attended a presentation/demo by the GC OEM and GC Prosecutor's office on county level supports for local municipalities that are enacted in the event of an incident on our campus. Information was turnkeyed at the GPSD Safety & Security Meeting.
