1/20

1/9/20- successful completion of immunization audit
1/21/20 – Re-organization of Epi-pen delegate training materials and records
1/21/20 -Distribution of Emergency bag which includes Bleeding Control Kit to school SRO
1/21/20- Placement of Bleeding Control Kit in each AED case. Created signage to post next to AED cabinet to indicate presence of Bleeding Control Kit
1/21/20- Distribution of Sudden Cardiac Arrest Action Plan and list of MERT members to building personnel via e-mail
1/21/20- Re-organization of medical emergency supplies and bags in nurse's office. List of what items are in each bag and where items are located for more expedient access
1/21/20- Notice sent home with all students highlighting flu season and requests to keep children home with fever, vomiting and repetitive coughing
1/21/20 Ongoing communication with office staff and Principal related to increased illnesses absences and need for excused absences for some students
1/22/20- Ongoing communication with district nurses in efforts to set up CPR/AED training for the spring. Considerations include location, staff availability, field trips, PARCC testing
1/23/20- Provided medical information for 504 meeting for a student related to medical documented condition.
1/23/20- Review of district attendance policy related to student absences and excused absences. Made suggestions for possible revision at our school level
1/28/20- Review of district policy 8441- Care of Ill and Injured Persons. Reviewed in conjunction with Medical Standing orders and will review with district nurses and make recommendations for possible policy revision
