- Thespian Troupe 1418 packed up the canned goods collected for the Trick or Treat so Kids Can Eat Food Drive and delivered them to the Samaritan Center of Glassboro. By assisting with the delivery, they were able to see the difference they were making; there

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were only a few boxes of cereal on the shelves at the food bank. Thanks to our students and faculty, we were able to raise over 600 lbs. of food.

- The Glassboro High School Marching Band finished its competitive season on November 1st at the Atlantic Coast Championships, held in Hershey Park Stadium. Through the season, the band showed steady improvement in their performance and scores. Highlights of the season include: First Place - Clearview NJMBDA Competition (Best Music Award, First Place - Williamstown NJMBDA Competition (Best Music, Best Visual, and Best Effect Awards), and Second Place - Cinnaminson TOB. The percussion section received the second-highest percussion score at the TOB Region Championships (out of 10 bands) and the eighth-highest score at the Atlantic Coast Championships (out of 22 bands). The final competition for the band on November first yielded a ranking of 12 out of 22 bands at Hershey Stadium.
- On October 15th, twelve of our tenor and bass choir vocal students had the incredible opportunity to participate in the Tenor | Bass Festival at Rowan University, joining nearly 1,000 other singers from high schools across the tri-state area. It was such an inspiring day of music making, connection, and representation for GHS. Our students worked with Rowan's Dr. Christopher Thomas and Vinroy D. Brown, Jr., who led the massive choir through powerful repertoire and meaningful conversations about artistry and community. The day concluded with a concert, which was performed for all of the teachers in attendance. It was amazing to see our students fully engaged, singing with confidence, meeting new people, and taking in the experience of being part of something that big and collaborative.
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
