### English/Social Studies

English I students in Baldissero's class completed their unit on *Romeo and Juliet* which emphasized the text lens and patterns reading strategy. Ms. Stillwell, a student teacher from Rowan created, creative projects for the students to complete during PARCC testing week. Fro Mr. Wood's English II classes King Arthur reigned supreme. Students read Arthurian Legends, including Sir Gawain and the Green Knight and Le Morte D'Arthur, in preparation for the upcoming field trip to the Medieval Arms Exhibit at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. Students designed their own coat of arms and each class ratified its own chivalric code of honor.

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English II students completed their unit on *Antigone* and the Greek Theater. MST student teacher Jordan Kaufman completed her thesis research on peer editing and revising with Honors students who are narrowing and researching debate topics.

Mrs. Hartman's English III and Honors students completed the drafting portion of their MLA research paper with a focus on proper documentation of sources, writing leads and writing conclusions. Students also conducted peer critiques.

Ms. Jones students in Psychology learned about stress and how to analyze their own level of stress.

American History I students made dream catchers on *Take Your Child to Work Day* while studying the culture clash between white settlers and Native Americans during the period of Westward Expansion. Students had also studied the failures and successes of Reconstruction.

70 students from grades 9-12 attended the Main Stage Theater's production of *The Complete Abridged Works of William Shakespeare*, a trip run by the English Department.

Ms. Rorer and Mr. Humes enriched their students' knowledge of history by visiting the Holocaust Museum, the Washington Monument and the Reflection Pool.

Maureen Morrison and Joan Beebe with help from Renaissance produced this year's Mr. Glassboro event raising over \$900 for the Renaissance program at the high school.

With the help of Megan Jones and Christy Baldissero, GHS raised over \$1000 for the March of Dimes and many students participated in the walk held at Rowan University on Sunday April 30<sup>th</sup>.

Rachel's Challenge was brought to the high school by Mrs. Ragozzino with Mrs. Hartman's help.

Ms. Keating finalized the summer STEAM applications for Rowan.

Both GHS and GIS participated in the Rowan Fossil Dig at the Rowan Fossil Park. A total of 115 students participated in all. Our Art and STEM students painted 51 boulders for the Fossil Park in honor of Earth Day. Noah Johnston created a banner for Rowan which read “Dig Fossils not Fossil Fuels”.

All members of the class of 2016 are cleared for graduation by the NJDOE. Currently, there are 20 members of the class of 2017 not yet cleared.

### Band

The GHS Concert Band, Jazz Ensemble, vocal ensembles and String Orchestra presented the GHS MIOSM Concert on March 15<sup>th</sup>.

The **GHS Jazz Ensemble** earned a rating of EXCELLENT at the Cavalcade of Bands NJ Regional Jazz Championships which were hosted at Lakeside Middle School in Millville on April 9<sup>th</sup>. Raymond Clayton was recognized with a solo award for his performance on piano.

The Jazz Ensemble presented a pre-concert performance for the Bowe School band and the Bowe School band concert audience on April 26<sup>th</sup>. This performance featured two vocal soloists as well as our instrumental soloists with the group. The performance served as a recruiting tool to inspire the younger students to continue participating in the band program. It also allowed parents and others to see the potential growth that can take place as their children progress through the grade levels. The group continues to rehearse in the morning before block 1.
