ATHLETICS

We visited ComTec Systems Inc. from Vineland in July on STEM training http://www.comtecusa.net/ and training the staff and the students in computer hardware and networking during the 2014-2015 school year through the Engineering Club after school.

Mrs. Keating went to the Maker Studio in July for training on the 3D printer. She is anxious to take the STEM students as well.

GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT

The ninth grade/new student orientation that was held in August went well. The guidance department was busy over the summer helping to create and adjust the GHS Master schedule.

BUSINESS/TECHNOLOGY/FCS DEPARTMENTS

The Seeds to Success Farm-stand Project was a huge success this summer. It was open for 5 weeks over the summer through the months of July and August. Eight Glassboro High School students participated and were employees of the Farm-stand. This project provides year-round, in-school business training and life skills education with a paid summer work experience. Seeds to Success extends beyond workforce preparation. The Farm-stand is a unique example of economic development serving the community by bringing new business and affordable, nutritious, New Jersey grown foods to the residents, while at the same time, supporting local farmers.

WORLD LANGUAGE/MUSIC/ART DEPARTMENTS
