English

English III: Students worked in groups to collaborate on and present powerpoints on educational innovations. We debriefed and they evaluated themselves and their classmates providing constructive suggestions for improving these. Students also engaged in discussion on topics from The Crucible and have been reading informational articles on the history of the Salem Witch Trials, Arthur Miller, and the Red Scare to prepare to read the play. Students continue to develop their vocabularies using new words in creative stories. They also wrote a second reaction paper and a poem using the style of George Ella Lyon's "Where I'm From" as a mentor text.

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AP Literature: Students finished reading *The Catcher in the Rye* and "For Esme with Love and Squalor" finding similarities between the two themes, characters and style of the two texts. Students used these texts to practice timed free response writing for the AP test. They also created a data sheet to use while studying for the exam. After students analyzed several sample student essays they used the Common Application essay questions to generate their own, They have been analyzing diction with short exercises from Voice Lessons from Nancy Dean.

ELA Test Prep: Students took the SATs on November 4th and prepared for the ASVAB on December 12th.

H English II: Students completed the Unit 1 EdConnect assessment. Students composed informative essays about acts of civil disobedience. During the writing process, students learned how to paraphrase and compose creative hooks. Students also read and annotated *Night* by Elie Wiesel. Students viewed a TED Talk and a short film and read the short story "Harrison Bergeron". Students were introduced to rhetoric and purpose and continue to analyze rhetoric via a reciprocal teaching project. A reciprocal teaching project was introduced to the students at the end of the month. Students take the role of the teacher, present a passage from their assigned chapter and complete a close read with their "students". Students are actively partaking in google classroom, google forms, and flipgrid. Students continue to learn in-context and tiered vocabulary.

English IV: Students just completed the MRE challenge where they had the opportunity to work with the US Army. Students were allowed to be creative and mix different items in MREs to come up with a tasty concoction. This activity taught students how to work collaboratively and how to be creative. They were judged on taste and presentation. Students are working on their Into the Wild part of Unit 2 in the curriculum. They are identifying a minimalist lifestyle and trying to identify some key components that led to the demise of Chris McCandless.

English I: Students took the Unit 1 Edconnect Assessment. The class moved into Greek Mythology.

ELA II: Students worked on vocabulary in context and grammar; Students read the first 200 pages of *All American Boys*, and answered text-based questions; Students watched video clips related to social injustice and responded in writing; Students took notes on characters and themes, and participated in class discussions related to race and peaceful protests

ESL: Completed Common Lit Unit on Happiness/Continued ACCESS and SAT prep

English II: Students took the Unit 2 Edconnect Assessment. The class moved onto Antigone. The students debated about to whom loyalty should be given. The class is reading the play and holding discussions about the loyalties of Creon and Antigone.

AP Composition: In addition to writing argumentative synthesis essays, students in AP Compworked through a unit on theories of education. Students read John Dewey, Maria Montessori,

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Ben Franklin and others in an exploration of the purposes and pedagogy of American public schooling. Several administrators visited students for two days from Glassboro Public Schools, including building principals and the superintendent; they asked questions of each other during a robust dialogue regarding success in the educational and career world. In addition to regular grammar and writing instruction, students analyzed the film *Dead Poets Society*, as well as contemporary criticism about it, to determine the filmmakers' claims about the nature and value of education and how the public should receive it.

<u>History</u>

American History II: American History II: During the first half of November, we studied the 1950s and the Cold War. I have tried to incorporate diverse strategies/activities throughout the semester; these include (but are not limited to), source analysis exercises, guided notetaking, contemporary film analysis, creative writing, tech-based lectures/discussions, etc. I always try to highlight certain themes throughout the course, and "conformity" was a major theme of our study of the postwar period. During the second half of the month we began our study of the 1960s (namely Kennedy, Johnson, and the Counterculture) and we focused on how this decade was a time of change rather than conformity. Cold War tensions are another major focus of the units covered in this month. I have been highlighting current connections between the totalitarian governments of both the Soviet Union and contemporary North Korea. A major aspect of our class has been to study recent developments regarding N. Korea, and I feel that the students appreciate the relevance between historic content and their current society.

World History: THE INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION SLIDES PRESENTATION.

Industrialization brought dramatic changes to society. The Industrial Revolution was a key point to ushering in the modern world. Did the changes that industrialization brought promote positive or negative effects? Explain your reasoning. Your job will be to create a slides presentation on the benefits of industrialization. Your presentation should convince the reader that the Industrial Revolution marked a time of great progress for the world. You will use the Google slides program to create the slide presentation and place it in the Google classroom.

U.S. History I: In the U.S. I course we are currently on the topic of urbanization. In order to better understand immigration, we completed a virtual tour of Ellis Island that gave an interactive experience through primary source documents about the hardships faced by immigrants to the United States. We also played a role play game that allowed the students to act out some of the struggles immigrants faced when trying to enter the U.S.

World History: In World History our current topic is imperialism. We have completed a webquest and a research project to help the students understand the European motives for imperialism. Also, we played a risk-style game that allowed students to create alliances in an authentic activity to understand imperialism.

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Business

Real World has been working on Workplace Health and safety including OSHA, Ergonomics and Personal Protective Equipment. We have also covered Workplace Legal Matters, including Labor Unions/Labor Laws, Civil and Criminal Law, and Finding & Evaluating Legal Services.

Sports & Entertainment Marketing students have been focusing on Marketing Mix as it relates to Price, Product and Market Research. They have also been introduced to the concept of "Brand" and the many aspects that relate to branding, including sponsorship, endorsements, logos, slogans and trademarks.

Software Applications students completed Microsoft word office applications using TestOut Software. They are moving on to complete applications in Microsoft Excel.

Band

Jazz Ensemble and Small Ensembles

The band program at GHS will once again be offer students many varied opportunities to perform in and out of the school. Visits to the senior center and assisted living homes are being planned. The Jazz Ensemble performed at the Glassboro Idol singing competition. The ensemble is also making plans to perform at Rowan University and several Cavalcade of Bands sponsored HS Jazz Festivals. The mixed instrument ensemble, Brassboro, performed at the Boro In Lights event on December 1st.

GHS Marching Band

The Marching Band participated in the three Cavalcade of Bands festivals. Millville (10/7), Delsea (10/21) and Vineland (11/4). They saw and increase in score by about 5 points after each show. A highlight was placing 2nd at the Delsea competition. In addition to the varsity football games, the marching band will be participated at two community events in Glassboro – the Italian Festival and Unity Day. They also participated in parades in Glassboro, Alloway, Haddon Township, Pitman, Salem and West Cape May. They also performed for the Boro In Lights tree lighting.

The Marching Band will performed for the Bowe School band students on November 20th as a part of its recruiting and outreach activities. The band performed its field show in the gymnasium.

Math/Science

Currently, there are 5 seniors not cleared for graduation. They are working in their Test Prep Courses to prepare for the state approved exam. They are waiting for results from October's PSAT and plan to take the ASVAB in December, the ACT in February, and the SAT in March.

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Ms. Keefer's biology classes we are currently working on the Genetics UbD unit. Students just completed the Dragon Genetics Lab in which they cross their pet dragon with a pet dragon belonging to a classmate to determine what traits the offspring will have due to the random mixing of genetic traits. They used popsicle sticks, representing chromosomes, to learn about Mendel's Law of Independent Assortment and how the different types of dominance play a role in inheritance and variation. Students then decoded the inherited genes to determine the phenotype of their pets' offspring. Partners then used these traits to draw their pets' babies and then answer analysis questions.

STEM:

Ms. Barr, Ms. Aruffo and Ms. Keating met with Rowan's Robotics Club to begin exposing the students to both Vex and Lego robotics. The RRC is going to Bowe school this month to demonstrate some of their robotics to the STEM class. In the spring, RRC will come to GIS and GHS for demonstrations.

Ms. Barr, Ms Aruffo and Ms Keating are also working with Rowan on the FLL competition being held in January. We are ordering trophies, shirts and food for the competition, which will be held on 1/20/18 from 7-4pm.

The STEM committee is encouraging all schools in the district to participate in the National Hour of Code week, which is 12/4 - 12/8. Sue Kornicki is assisting the STEM committee in their efforts.

Applications for all 3 Academies are due by 12/1. The committees will meet to finalize the out of district students before the state mandated deadline of 12/20. Acceptance and wait list letters will be sent out by 12/20 for out of district students. Glassboro students will receive their letters in the spring.
