INSTRUCTION / STUDENT NOTES:

English/History

Dr. Preston has assumed the role of Department Chairperson for these departments.

Honors and CP English III students concluded their unit on *The Crucible* which incorporated related non-fiction reading strategies. CP practiced close reading and open ended response writing while Honors classes wrote a literary analysis.

Honors English III students are currently conducting research into human trafficking after reading and responding to the novel *Sold* over the holidays.

Both classes completed a book promotion for their independent reading based on WHYY's *Why I Like This Book*.

AP Composition students began a unit on Government, reading works from such authors as Machiavelli, Carl Becker and Hannah Arendt. Students have also begun a crash course on writing using the five brushstrokes of writing--the participle, the absolute, the appositive, adjectives out of order and action verbs.

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CP English II:

- Read informational texts about the Vietnam War (CommonLit) to identify the historical context of *The Things They Carried*
- Read *The Things They Carried*
- Analyzed an author's writing process and character development through close reads of *The Things They Carried*
- Read and analyzed "The Soldier" by Rupert Brooke. Focused on imagery, rhetoric, and tone. Wrote poems from a character's perspective in *The Things They Carried*; students had to maintain a specific tone and incorporate imagery to show the speaker's emotions/feelings towards events in the novel.

Math/Science

STEM:

Mrs. Keating had a meeting with Rowan, 12/18/18, regarding a STEM Grant for 2019-2020. We are working with Clayton, Boys and Girls Club and Rowan on the grant.

Mrs. Keating scheduled all Academy and 1/3 students for the spring semester at Rowan.

STEM is preparing to host the FLL competition again at GIS in January for Rowan. Finalist will compete in the State Competition in March at Rowan.

Rowan's Robotics team is meeting with GHS students to start a Robotics team here. They will hold their first meeting in January during lunch in Mrs. Keating's room.

Engineering club is finishing the tables for the FLL competition, so we won't have to borrow tables from Rowan this year.

Rowan's BioMed professors come monthly to meet GHS students in Mrs. Power's room and conduct activities to promote interest in BioMed. This Thursday, 12/20, is their December meeting.

Both BioMed and STEM have accepted 2 Out of District students for the 2019-2020 school year. All seats are full at this time. STEM and BioMed will review Glassboro applications in March and students will be notified in April.

STEM again participated in the National Hour of Code week in December throughout the district.

Mrs. Rynkiewicz: This month, one cleared their NJ State Testing Graduation Requirement on their December ASVAB. Nine students remain 'not cleared' and are still participating in the alternative pathways to graduation. These basic skills students have not yet demonstrated proficiency on a state approved exam in order to be cleared for graduation. Six students are working in math, and three students are working in both math and English to achieve their goal. After the holidays, students will continue to prepare for exams, as well as begin the Portfolio Appeal Process. All students are signed up for the next ACT.

In Ms. Keefer's Biology classes we are starting our last UBD unit, Evolution. Students will complete assignments to gain knowledge on topics such as natural selection, diversity, variation, and how these things affect populations. They will complete a lab activity in

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which the students take on the role of a paleontologist to investigate how fossilized bones suggest information about the evolutionary history of species. The unit culminates with a performance task in which they will work as a group of researchers that has recently discovered several fossils off the coast of Mexico. The task is to take the scientific data of this new animal and create a written and visual profile of the organism that can be used to classify the new discovery.

In Integrated Geometry; we worked on Chapter 9 which dealt with transformation properties. The kids did a fun project where they took a letter from the word geometry and had to do several transformations to that letter. The end result was really a piece of art and made a great decoration for the doorway of the classroom. We also spent a lot of time on Chapter 5. This chapter covers relationships with triangles. Juniors spent class time prepping for ASVAB. We have incorporated the IXL computer software. It provides practice for the topics covered in class, provides us with lots of data, and tracks the students' progress. We also continue to work on Parcc problems. This month we looked at released student responses and the scores that were given so the students could compare high scoring responses to low scoring ones. They practiced being the teacher and grading responses as well.
