Math/Science

STEM:

Glassboro STEM Academy was the site for the Southern Regional FIRST Lego League qualifier last Saturday. We were host to 11 Jr teams, their coaches and parents, in addition to, 12 FLL teams, their coaches and parents. In total, we had around 300 guests at GIS. The top 4 teams move onto the FLL state competition being held at Rowan in March. We had 40 staff and student volunteers, who helped make our 2nd qualifier a complete success.

Rowan's Robotics Team meets monthly during lunch to work with robotics.

Rowan's Bio Medical professors meet twice a month during lunch to expose students to Bio Medical Engineering. The meetings are listed below:

- January 31 Presentation Introduction to Biomedical Engineering. This interactive presentation will go over the many things one can do with a BME degree and advice on how to apply to BME programs
- February 14 Activity Protect the Pill. Students will learn about designing and developing pill tablet coatings and the systems that apply these coatings
- February 28 Presentation Biomaterials Students will learn about undergraduate track options that specialize in biomaterials and career options in the biomaterials space
- March 14 Activity A drinkable density experiment. To understand the concept of density and how density is important in blood measurements
- March 28 Presentation Tissue Engineering (TE). Students will learn about undergraduate track options that specialize in TE and career options in the TE space
- April 11 Activity Build a Simple Robotic Hand. Students will learn the basics of prosthetics through building a robotic hand
- April 25 Presentation Biomedical Robotics. Students will learn about undergraduate track options that specialize in robotics and career options in the biomedical robotics space
- May 29 Activity Rowan Visit Students will have the opportunity to visit the biomedical engineering labs
- May 30 Presentation Survey Students will complete a survey to help us improve the program for the year 2019-2020 JETS are preparing for their March competition.

In Mrs. Shoemaker's resource Integrated Geometry class we studied a unit on relationships within triangles. One lesson focused on the Triangle Inequality Theorem. Students completed an experiment where they discovered this theorem. The activity consisted of students working in small groups and using spaghetti noodle to determine if a triangle can be formed. The three tasks had the students breaking pieces of spaghetti into three different sized pieces and they had to try

and form a triangle. They reflect as a group on their findings throughout the experiment. Students discovered when they can form a triangle with three given lengths. To follow up this activity, students completed a scavenger hunt around the room to assess their level of understanding with this new theorem.

There are currently 8 seniors who have not passed a standardized test in order to be cleared for graduation. Students are currently working on their Portfolio Appeal under the direction of Mrs. Rynkiewicz and Mrs. Faulkner. These students will take the ACT at RCGC in February, the ACCUPLACER in March at GHS or RCGC, the PSAT and the ASVAB at GHS in April. They are also encouraged to take and additional SAT sometime in early spring.

There are currently 22 juniors who have not passed a standardized test in order to be cleared for graduation. Students met with Dr. Sneathen, Ms. Boyd, Ms. Mattioli, Ms. Ragozzino, Ms. Rynkiewicz, Ms. Faulkner, and Mr. Tarasevich so they could review their current scores and make a plan to achieve clearance as soon as possible, preferably before June 2018. These students can take the SAT or the ACT sometime in the spring. They will take the PSAT and the ASVAB in school in April. They will be given a PARCC in their math and English courses. Demonstrating proficiency on any of these tests will clear these students for graduation.
