INSTRUCTION / STUDENT NOTES:

ENGLISH/HISTORY

African American History students studied the Great Depression. The Library of Congress has great photographs of Glassboro in the late 1930's. The Farm Security Administration had an unsuccessful project called Eighty Acres (which is now the Elsmere section of town). We had fun looking at the photographs and matching it with both genealogy records of the time and google maps of today. We also looked at African Americans' role in WWII. Finally we've started the Civil Rights Movement. These are just a few of the topics covered. Also June 3rd we will be making a trip to the African American History Museum in Washington DC. We are super excited!

U.S. History I: Students learned about American imperialism and the causes of U.S. involvement in WWI. As part of their learning students completed infographic projects to display research findings about American imperialism. Authentic connections were made when they were also tasked with determining how the age of imperialism affected countries that were placed under U.S. control today. Also, students analyzed several primary source documents related to WWI detailing the daily lives, politics, and hardships of the war.

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Human Anatomy – In Ms. Keefer’s Human Anatomy class students are completing the current unit which deals with communication, control, and integration. Students have learned about the nervous and are moving onto the endocrine systems. Also, students discover how they are the “command” centers that need work together to ensure proper function of the human body. The performance task for this unit has students watching a PBS special called “Inside the Teenage Brain” that discusses the science behind teenage behavior, relationships, and decision making. Students will answer various questions and construct an individual portfolio highlighting their “Teenage Brain” moments.
