**CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION (C&I)**

- COVID-19 lessons focus on SEL/Mindfulness, the Ethics of Care & Hierarchy of Needs
- Driver's Ed. Students were given the opportunity to take their written test on campus. Additional dates will be forthcoming.
- As of June 2020, 42 seniors did not meet the NJ Graduation Assessment Requirement. We are now down to 30.
  - These students are being guided through the process of signing up for SATs, ACTs, and the Accuplacer by our guidance department and Mrs. Rynkiewicz
    - Note - GHS plans to give the PSATs on January 26<sup>th</sup>.
    - The Portfolio Window opens on January 4<sup>th</sup>.
      - To date, we have not yet received portfolio directions from the Gloucester County Office of Education.

## **FACILITIES**

- Health Office - A new health office is needed in the immediate future to ensure student confidentiality and adequate storage space.
- Music Rooms - In order to properly store and maintain our instruments, new cabinets are requested. In addition, the flooring needs to be replaced.
- Adaptive Gym (Auxiliary Gym) – Padding (walls) and flooring should be considered for replacement.
- Media Center - New flooring, layout, furniture, technology, and shelves are essential to meet our student's needs.
- Outdoor restrooms and a new concession should be considered. Outdoor facilities would eliminate the need to rent portable restrooms and allow GHS to host larger events in the future, including our graduation ceremony.
- Gymnasium - Floor and bleachers should be considered for replacement.
- TV Tech/ LIFE Program - To meet the programs' curricular needs, it is requested that these areas be redesigned and new equipment purchased.
- Classrooms/Furniture - It is recommended that all classrooms be provided with new teachers' desks and chairs due to their condition. It is further recommended that new bulletin boards be installed in each classroom to help with the building's upkeep by allowing space for student work, rather than taping/adhering posters to walls, which in turn causes damage.
