Summer Enrichment Program 2023
The Summer Enrichment Program took place at Dorothy L Bullock School for students in grades K-5 and Thomas E Bowe School for students in grades 6-8 from July 10 to August 3, Monday through Thursday from 8:30-11:30am. A total of 116 students were enrolled: 81 in grades K to 5 and 35 in grades $6-8$. The program was open to all students in grades K-5 with priority placements given to those who were identified as eligible for basic skills services. Students in grades 6-8 were identified through MAP and end of year subject area grades. Students were instructed at their individual levels based on end of the year MAP assessment data in the areas of ELA and Math and end of year grades from their classroom teachers. Teachers utilized the Eureka Math program, skills-based literacy lessons for each grade level, and the Fundations Ready to Rise curriculum for students in grades K-2. Lessons were delivered utilizing multiple means including SeeSaw and Google Classroom as well as hands-on tasks and assessments. Teachers were able to not only ensure students were maintaining their skill levels, but also provided opportunities for enrichment. Classes in grades K-5 were split between two teachers allowing teachers to work in small groups in content area skills. Students in grades 6 through 8 were instructed by teachers with content area specialization in math and ELA. The program had an average attendance rate of $65-75 \%$ for the $6-8^{\text {th }}$ grade students and $70-85 \%$ for students in grades K-5. Teachers and administration were in contact with the parents of students with attendance concerns after the first week to encourage them to attend. A handful of students missed days due to vacations or health related issues. Students who were also enrolled in the Jurassic program missed the days when they would be
taking trips since parents would not have childcare at the school for their children if they did not go on the trips. All students in grades 6-8 utilized district transportation as did most students at Bullock with a few opting to drop off and pick up their students each day in the lower grade levels.
