Attached is our annual request for use of the school district buildings for Camp RASKEL and Camp Horizon/JURASSIC Summer Learning Programs. I appreciate the Administration/Board of Education's consideration of our request, as these camps bridge the school year and support Glassboro students in their summer learning. These camps also allow parents to continue to work and have reliable, affordable and quality child care during the most needed time of the year – summer break.

We request the school district to permit us to use the school buildings Monday through Friday, as we did last summer, at no cost. We request the use of J. Harvey Rodgers School to serve approximately 60 students in grades PreK4-2 and Dorothy L. Bullock School to serve up to 150 students in grades 3-8.

Grades 3-8 camp childcare fees are covered **in full for the first 4 weeks** by our NJ Department of Education 21CCLC and in part by NJ Juvenile Justice Commission grants during the second four weeks, and grades PreK-2 will be partially covered by grants and tuition assistance from the United Way of Gloucester County, the United Way of Northern NJ, and the County of Gloucester, so parents have financial support for childcare during this time. There will be nominal fees for off-site educational trips.

In summer of 2024 we served an average of 160 students each day in grades PreK4-8. We expect to have a similar, robust enrollment in 2025.

We further request use of Glassboro School district buses, for which we have always paid, to transport students to local educational trips to enhance the STEM and Life Skills themes of our camps. We will work with GPSD transportation department Diane Veight, to coordinate trips, as we have done in the past.

The Glassboro school calendar indicates the last day of school is June 18. We would like to get into the schools on June 19 to set up (we are closed June 20)and then we would like to operate the camp from the week of Monday June 23 through Friday August 15 at both schools. We will be closed July 4<sup>th</sup>. We realize additional snow days may affect the June start date. As soon as this is approved, we will begin to roll out registration for our district's children.
