Need: Describe the problem or deficiencies that exist which require the improvements described.

Many of our students shrug when we ask what they want to be when they grow up. We have had many conversations to try to understand what barriers may be keeping our students from developing a long-range plan. From these discussions, we have noticed that a large number of 8th graders are unsure where their strengths lie, do not see how their unique talents can be used in a professional setting, or have a goal in mind without a plan. We know how much potential our students have and want to help them see it in themselves before they decide what to be involved with in high school and pursue their first jobs. This program will help students envision their future and develop the skills and knowledge they need to pursue it.

## Strategy: Briefly describe your plan to alleviate the need/problem.

This program builds on the 8th grade Career Speaker Series, which will be in its third year this year. In the fall, we will spend 10 weeks guiding 50 students through a ten week course focused on career and soft skill readiness. As part of the program, students will take the Clifton StrengthsExplorer, which helps them identify 3 areas of strength. As teachers, we had the opportunity to take the adult version of the assessment and feel strongly that students would benefit from understanding their "top 3" and how it can apply both as a student and in the working world. Students will create resumes and practice interview skills. These lessons will support the kinds of activities and learning that are already happening in Business and AVID.

**Background**: In 2023, we began a Lunchtime Career Speaker Series to help 8th grade students envision their future. Since then we have had over 30 community members from a variety of backgrounds share their journeys with our students.

**Goal:** In addition to inspiring students about future possibilities, we want to ensure that they have the disposition, knowledge, and interpersonal skills to enter the world of work. Students will be applying to their first jobs and choosing what to be involved in when they move on to Glassboro High School and we want to help them develop confidence and passion with this initiative. Many of these ideas were driven by participation in the South Jersey Summer Institute for Educators, which connects a cohort of educators with business leaders for three weeks of intensive tours and panel discussions in the five counties of Southern New Jersey. We hope to support the related work that is done in the Business elective, AVID, and at the high school.

#### Format:

- 10 week fall program for two classes of 20 students, taking place during lunch/study skills from October through January. Students must apply by October 1st.
- Spring Career Speaker series, open to all 8th graders who sign up for individual sessions in advance.
