### C. Project Title and Description

Title of Project: Rachel's Challenge

Subject Area(s): This interactive assembly program for students, staff, and community members supports the interdisciplinary One Book Glassboro community-wide summer reading program as well as the our school district's anti-bullying campaign.

Approximate Number of Students Participating: 577 (all students)

Project Starting Date: One Book Summer Reading May, 2015 Project Completion Date: Spring, 2016 Event with ongoing Anti Bullying Campaign.

Need: Describe the problem or deficiencies that exist which require the improvements described.

Since undesirable behaviors like harassment, intimidation and bullying continue to be a problem in both society at large and in our school, we would like to help solve the problem by promoting the message of Rachel Joy Scott and continue the work she started at Columbine High School. Rachel was the first victim of the shooting at Columbine, yet her real legacy is the code of ethics she lived by which is outlined in *Chain Reaction*, a book written by her father and chosen as our community wide summer reading selection. The book explains how Rachel promoted the idea of compassion through her daily acts and how she created a ripple of kindness that was far-reaching. We would like to build a school culture that sustains the kind of safe, caring and supportive learning environment that is essential for academic achievement, and this assembly will encourage our students to examine their own behaviors and start a chain reaction of kindness themselves.

Strategy: Briefly describe your plan to alleviate the need/problem.

To bring more kindness and compassion to our school and the community we have already held informal classroom book talks on the summer reading, extended October's Week of Respect into an entire month and created monthly activities like our Thanksgiving Breakfast, Operation Christmas Child, and fundraising for the Susan G.Komen Kennedy Cancer Treatment Center. These activities are the mission of the Friends of Rachel Club established in March of 2012 after the initial Rachel's Challenge Day was held here at GHS. Since none of our current students have experienced the "Challenge Assembly" we would like to reignite the spirit of this program and increase participation. To equip both students and adults with strategies that create and sustain a safe and supportive learning environment, we will invite all staff, students and interested community members to a morning assembly titled "Awaken the Learner: Five Step School Improvement Process". A second session will focus on a more intensive program designed for students considered at-risk and an evening assembly will be held to introduce parents and interested community members to the program.

D. Objectives, Activities and Evaluation Techniques (This page may be duplicated if necessary)

Evaluation Techniques	designed by Marzano will assess student attitudes toward bullying harassment and intimidation and students perceptions of the climate and safety of their school.  A second post-test survey administered in June will measure perceived changes in the school culture two months later.  Anecdotal evidence will also be collected.
Completion Date	The assembly will be held on a day in the spring.  Related Rachel's Challenge activities in the school and in the community are ongoing
Program Activities to Accomplish Objectives	Two assemblies will be held during the day: the first 60 minute assembly, Awaken, is an inspiring kickoff event to create emotional connection and community buy-in. The Challenge Assembly focuses on five challenge Assembly focuses 2. Show compassion 3. Practice pre-acceptance 4. Learn from mistakes 5. Forgive yourself and others 5. Forgive yourself and others for up to 100 students including those at-risk. It tells a series of stories from the perspective of those whose lives were touched by Rachel and encourages participants to take specific steps toward making their own positive legacy a reality and trains them to be ambassadors of kindness.
Objectives	Participants will be equipped with strategies to identify and combat bullying intimidation and harassment.  Participants will learn that they are free to start a new legacy not defined by labels placed on them by others currently or in the past.  Participants will examine their own lives in light of personal challenges and learn strategies to dream big and start a chain reaction of kindness.  Students will be encouraged to get involved in Rachel's Challenge, promote positive change and not be a bystander.  Teachers will be introduced to a teacher's kit including related videos, lesson plans and assessments they can share in their classroom to sustain the message.
