Dr. S.,

After meeting with district testing coordinator and school testing team we are recommending the following as was conducted last year. Below are dates and rationale:

April 11- 18th 7th grade will come in at regular time April 19- 26th 8th grade will come in at regular time 8th grade will come on two hour delay 7th grade will come on a two hour delay

Based upon the success of last year's PARCC implementation at Glassboro Intermediate School, I am recommending we follow the same delayed opening schedule as the previous year. The paragraph below is inclusive of pertinent information relative to my recommendation\request.

We have elected to go with a delayed opening schedule with the hope of providing an optimal testing atmosphere by:

- This solution is better for the district as my school begins earlier than every other school. GIS will be done testing when other students are testing providing less (technology stress) for the district.
- This will provide opportunity for onsite technology assistance (boots on the ground)
- Offer a quiet, uninterrupted testing atmosphere (having students in the halls during testing, no bells)
- To allow for class time after testing
- Student will be tested in their normal biological testing cycle (GIS students are at their prime early in the morning)
- New testing procedures and formatting of the PARCC require us to monitor even more closer how testing is proceeding. This allow us to focus on testing, and not be interrupted by daily school issues during testing time.
- If a technology glitch occurs we can still transition to the second half of the day.
- Finally we worked on this schedule in conjunction with transportation, district personnel (testing supervisor) etc. and everyone is on board with our testing protocol.

With limited resources (not having a computer for every student in the building) a delayed opening schedule allows us to have a systematic way of testing a large group of students, with minimal impact on continuing classroom instruction during testing weeks. A letter to the parents is prepared and ready to go once given the go ahead
