Dear Parent/Guardian,

As you may know, the Glassboro Intermediate School has been selected by the New Jersey Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs to participate in the Inclusive Schools Climate Initiative (ISCI) which is funded through the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part B. During our involvement with this initiative, we will be engaged in ongoing development of a supportive and safe, school environment that is inclusive for all students.

A key component of the school's involvement in ISCI is the development of a comprehensive profile of the school environment to better understand the students' academic and social experiences. This spring, students will participate in an on-line survey focused on their day to day experiences at school. This survey is <u>not</u> a test, there are <u>no</u> right or wrong answers, students will <u>not</u> personally be evaluated in any way in relation to their responses, and will not take longer than 30 minutes to complete. Student names will <u>not</u> appear on or be associated with survey responses.

The research is confidential and research records may include some student information such as grade, gender, and age. This information will be stored in such a manner that some linkage between student identity and response in the research exists. The research team and the Institutional Review Board at Rutgers University are the only parties that will be allowed to see the data, except as may be required by law. The survey administration and data analysis will be conducted by the ISCI consultants at Rutgers University. The aggregated survey results will form the School Climate Profile that will be shared with our school.
