This is what I could uncover about the Explorer program you inquired about.

Hi! So sorry about the delay on this one...here you go!

The Gloucester County Community Partnership Grant was first awarded to the Bowe School by the Gloucester County Youth Services Commission in 2014. The design of the grant is to provide enrichment services to at-risk students/families (beyond your typical "homework helper" type of program). Most organizations/districts tend to utilize the funding to support alternate programming/supports at the HS level and beyond. The goal in Glassboro was to use the funding as a means to support students/families at the elementary level as a proactive measure. This was very well received by the county!

Bullock was asked to take over the grant in August of the following summer. We made the decision to partner with Golden Gate, INC and to focus specifically on the Hollybush community. Students were provided with afterschool

STEAM and Character ED/SEL programming from dismissal through 6pm. We also utilized the funding to supplement Golden Gate's summer programming, providing additional teachers and several trips. In the spring of 2020, Ms. Johnson had requested that the grant be shifted to GIS to offset programming costs once the SIG grant concluded.

Over the years, the grant funding has decreased from around 21K to 16K due to decreases funding and as a result of annual spending on our end. In addition to annual monitoring and reporting, we are required to attend the month YSC meetings which is a great opportunity to highlight the district, collaborate with similar programs & to network across the county. Rudolph Aikens oversees the grant. He is very supportive and is a pleasure to work with.
