RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

As part of Glassboro's SEL Program, twice a month, students may earn ten (10) points for attending Restorative Justice workshops (20 pts. per month). Restorative Justice workshops cover a wide range of topics to help students with mindfulness, building community and strengthening relationships, among other topics that benefit their social-emotional well-being. Please note that workshops are voluntary. In addition, students wanting to participate must be clear of any outstanding discipline. $Ex - Attend\ two\ Restorative\ Justice\ workshops\ (-20\ pts) + 30\ days'\ discipline\ free\ (-10\ pts) = -30\ pts\ in\ one\ month$

CONSEQUENCES AND HOURS

ALD - Administrative Lunch Detention: (30 min.)

ASD - After School Detention: 2:00-3:00 P.M. (1 hr.)

ESD - Extended School Day: 2:00-5:00 P.M. (3 hrs.)

FTS - Failure to Serve/Appear

OSS - Out of School Suspension

PRINCIPALS PROBATION

Once a student reaches twenty-five (25) points, he/she will become ineligible for athletics, extra-curricular activities, parking, early release, and all school related functions until the student's point total reduces to fifteen points and the student has gone thirty days without earning any additional points/discipline.

VIOLATIONS BEYOND THE CODE

Unfortunately, violations can occur in the high school setting beyond what is described above. When these violations occur, they need to be dealt with more severely because of the implications they can have and for the safe, orderly operation of our school. Discipline will begin at a minimum of the third offense.

DUE PROCESS/APPEAL PROCEDURES

A student has the right to appeal the discipline decision of a school administrator for any infraction resulting in an Out of School Suspension (OSS), and has the right to an advocate during the appeal process. Every effort is made to reach an agreement at the lowest level possible.

Timeline:

Appeal to Principal: Within forty-eight (48) hours of the Assistant Principals decision.

Appeal to Superintendent: Within five (5) days of the Principals decision

Appeal to Board of Education: Within five (5) days of the Superintendent's decision.
