Participation in ISCI involves working closely with consultants from Rutgers ISCI staff, forming an inclusive school climate leadership team, conducting the ISCI School Climate Survey, developing and implementing a School Climate Improvement Plan (SCIP), engaging in statewide and regional meetings designed for learning and sharing across ISCI school teams, mentoring future ISCI school teams, and engaging in other inclusive school climate leadership opportunities, such as presenting at workshops and conferences.

Your school's participation in ISCI also includes the opportunity to access a \$2500 stipend to support the implementation of your SCIP. The ISCI stipend shall be used toward efforts that support the school-wide implementation of the SCIP. These efforts may include, but are not limited to, the introduction, coordination and/or improvement of programs and efforts in the following areas:

- Social, emotional, and character development (SECD)
- Professional learning communities (PLCs)
- Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (HIB) prevention and intervention

### **STIPEND REIMBURSEMENT REQUEST FORM 2015-2016**

**Introduction:** Each participating school in ISCI is permitted to receive a stipend of up to \$2,500 to reimburse for expenditures related to the implementation of the School Climate Improvement Plan (SCIP). ISCI is supported by IDEA, Part B funds, and proposed expenditures must be consistent with allowable expenses under IDEA. We will work with you and the NJ Department of Education to ensure that proposed expenditures are allowable. In general, please adhere to costs that support professional development, programs for students, curricular materials, etc. We will not be permitted to approve food, gifts/gift cards, or prizes, as examples of non-allowable expenditures. Each proposed budget item on the Budget Plan will be reviewed and determined allowable or not. Only expenditures consistent with your SCIP and allowable under IDEA, Part B, will be approved. Once a budget item is approved, your school may purchase the item and then submit the Stipend Reimbursement Request Form (with proof of purchase) for reimbursement.

**Instructions:** On the following pages, please find the Budget Plan template and the Stipend Reimbursement Request Form.

- 1) Please use the Budget Plan to outline the amounts of your planned purchases, a description of each purchase, and the related activities from your SCIP that these expenditures support. Please submit initial Plan **by November 30, 2015**. Your expenditures may total \$2,500 for the school year. The Plan may be resubmitted if your school wishes to add, eliminate, or change budget items.
- 2) Your Budget Plan and any resubmissions will be reviewed promptly for consistency with your SCIP and allowable IDEA, Part B expenditures, and once approved, you will be able to purchase the item(s) indicated.
- 3) After the purchase is complete, please track your expenditure(s) on the Stipend Reimbursement Request Form. Submit the completed Form and include a proof of purchase for each expenditure. In general, a proof of purchase will include an invoice or purchase order and a copy of the check used for payment. We will promptly submit a reimbursement request to Rutgers University and a check made out to your district will be mailed to your school. You may submit the completed Form and proof of purchases throughout the school year, however please include all expenditures on one Form with all expenditures for the year listed. All purchases outlined in your Budget Plan must be made **by June 3, 2016**. The final Stipend Reimbursement Request Form and proof of purchases must be submitted **by June 17, 2016**.

**Maximum Audience Size per Board Game:** 300 – 400 students, divided into 3 teams

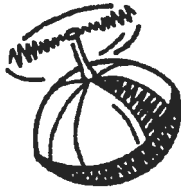
**Performance Space/Venue:** Approximately 36 ft. x 36 ft. Suitable for gym, multi-purpose room, or outdoor area.

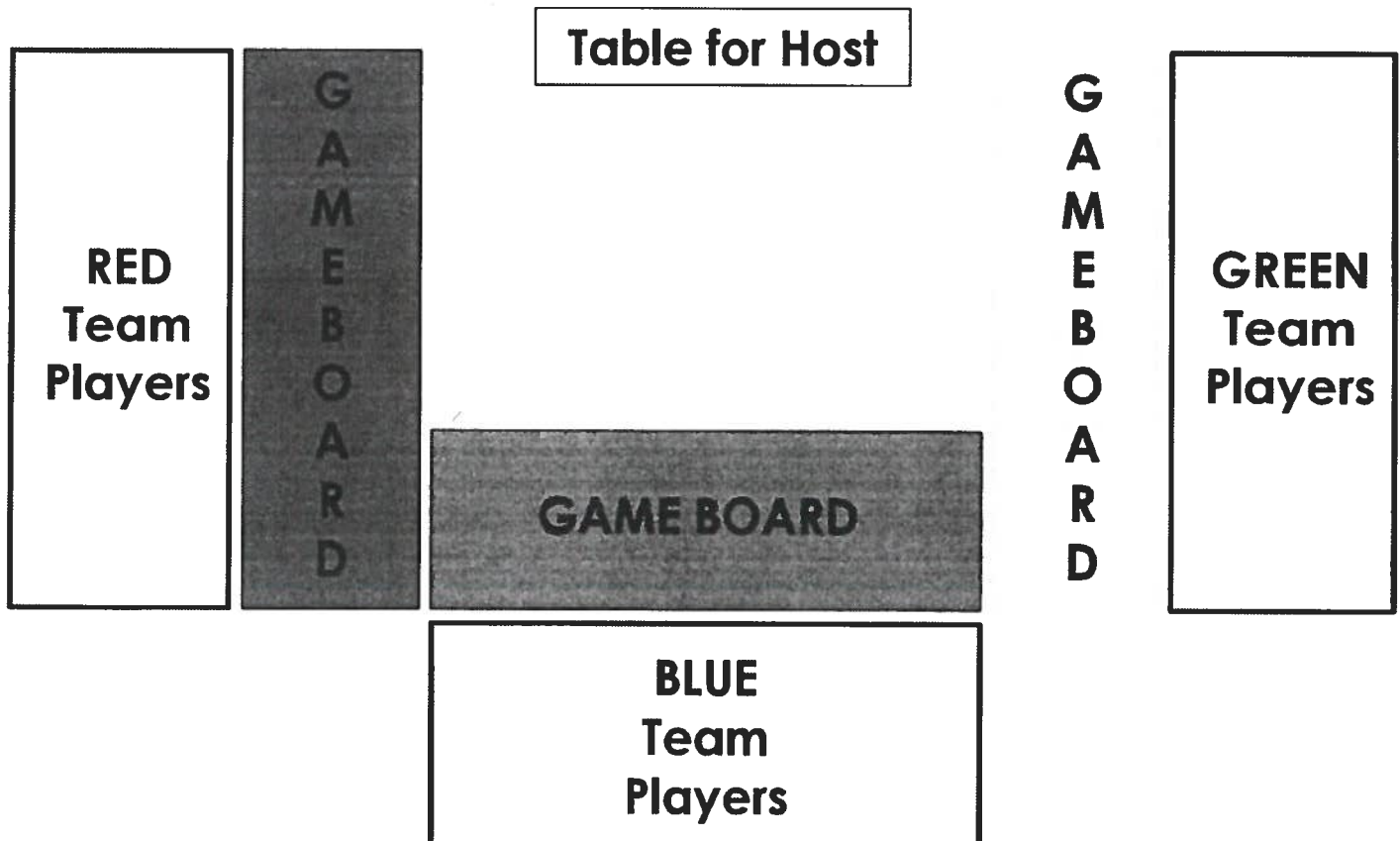
