If yes, part time or full time (circle one) No Yes **Board Action Requested:** I am seeking board approval to rescind the approval of Dustin Dapp, GHS Social Studies Teacher, to lose his prep to cover a World History Class. Mr. Dapp optioned out of the course overage as is his contractual right. Mr. Dapp teaches a full course load and volunteers to prepare students for the AP Psychology Exam (and has had great success!). Additionally, he advises the Student Government Association at GHS and the Mock Trial Team. **Details and ramifications:** At this time, 21 students still do not have a World History teacher for their class during Semester 2. **Positives:** New hire Brittany Cox could be moved from a ½ teacher to a 2/3 part time teacher at minimal cost to the district and this would solve the issue. Ms. Johnson is working on a cost analysis for this increase to Ms. Cox's responsibilities. Concerns: If the above solution is not considered it will come at the expense of an elective course in the Social Studies Department. Parent and student complaints will likely follow, and GHS will become less competitive with other area high schools, running the risk of losing more students to Choice Programs and GCIT and lowering our school ranking in various publications. (AP course offerings is a metric used.) **Other Comments:** GHS is sorely in need of an additional social studies teacher. Currently, 3.5 teachers cover 550 students. There are three years of required social studies courses in this state in order to graduate.
