RE: Targeted Review — Child Find Requirements - State Performance Plan Indicator 11

Dear Dr. Silverstein:

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires each state to have in place a State Performance Plan (SPP) and Annual Performance Report (APR) evaluating the state's implementation of Part B of the IDEA and describing how each State will improve such implementation. One of the SPP/APR indicators, Indicator 11- Child Find, requires each state to report the percentage of children, with parental consent to evaluate, who were evaluated to determine if eligible for special education and related services in accordance with federal and state requirements.

In October 2021, districts reported, through the NJSMART system, to the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) data concerning:

- Students referred to the child study team for an initial evaluation;
- Students for whom eligibility determinations were made; and
- Students for whom consent for initial IEP implementation was received between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.

If the initial evaluation timeline was not met for any student, the district reported the length of the delay beyond the 90 days and the reason for the delay.

Your district reported delayed Child Find timelines for the 2020-2021 school year. Although we recognize that timelines may have been impacted by the COVID-19 global pandemic beginning in March 2020, the requirements of the IDEA have remained in effect. As a result, in accordance with the requirements of the United States Department of Education, the New Jersey Department of Education, Office of Special Education (OSE) has determined that the district demonstrated noncompliance with the initial evaluation timeline requirement.

In order to demonstrate correction of noncompliance, in accordance with federal requirements, a district found noncompliant must:

- 1. Demonstrate that eligibility was determined for each evaluation conducted beyond the required timeline; and
- 2. Demonstrate that the district is correctly implementing the specific regulatory timeline requirement.

The OSE has verified, through NJSMART, that the district finalized each of the late evaluations, satisfying the requirement in number one above.

In order to demonstrate that your district has met the requirement in number two, specifically that the initial evaluation timeline is being implemented currently, your district must report to the OSE on timelines for the next three initial evaluations conducted by each child study team in the district after July 1, 2021.

Please submit the completed <u>Child Find Targeted Review Data Report</u> to Owen Buchanan, to <u>Owen.Buchanan@doe.nj.gov</u> by **September 24, 2022.** Please note that the signatures of the superintendent of schools and the director of special education are required on the completed report.

Following the review of the <u>Child Find Targeted Review Data Report</u> by the OSE, a written report of the status of correction will be issued. Corrective action will be required of districts that report continued noncompliance with timeline requirements. The OSE will continue to review compliance with the Child Find timelines through review of data reported by districts in NJSMART.

Districts that continue to report delays in the next NJSMART submission will receive a further review of practices and will be required to submit a <u>Child Find Targeted Review Data Report</u> to the OSE quarterly. Failure to correct noncompliance related to Child Find timelines within one year of the date of this letter will be considered in the state's determination of the local district's implementation of special education requirements.
