### 1. Meetings:

- a. Dr. Silverstein and I attended the Borough Council Meeting on 8/27/19. Council approved Resolution 299-19 authorizing award of a contract to Mateflex Corporation to initiate repairs of the tennis courts at Glassboro High School. On behalf of the BOE, we thanked the governing body for their support.
- b. Regina McCloskey has scheduled a meeting for September 13, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. at Borough Hall to introduce Julie Donofrio, Managing Director of PennPraxis to discuss Glassboro Growth Management Plan. Dr. Silverstein and I will not be able to attend. Ms. Johnson will represent the Administration. If any BOE members in available and interested, please advise and I will confirm your attendance.
- c. A NJSBA County Association Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 3, 2019 at Auletto's in Deptford. The topic of the dinner meeting is Restorative Justice. All BOE members can register online through the NJSBA website. There is no cost for participation.
- d. The board was in receipt of a letter from a retiree. I have included the letter along with a response for BOE information. We thank the retiree for the kind words and encourage all staff to consult with the leadership in their bargaining unit when issues arise in which they fell need to be addressed.

### 2. General Announcements

- a. Tonight, the board will be accepting the resignation of Dr. Danielle Sneathen, principal of the Glassboro High School. Dr. Sneathen has accepted the position of Assistant Superintendent in Vineland. We congratulate her and thank her for her service to the district over the past 5+ years.
- b. We are happy to announce the Carbon Monoxide Detector installation will be complete and fully functional prior to the September 5, staff and students first day. As a district, we are proud to be able to address and remedy issues to abate hazards while also using the incident to bring attention to the dangers of Carbon Monoxide and push for changes in state statutes. Glassboro is at the forefront of addressing the issue and probably the only district with hard wired CO detectors.
- c. The board will approve the 2018-2019 Superintendent's evaluation. Thanks to all of the members for providing feedback into the evaluation. We congratulate the

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superintended for receiving a commendable rating with highlights in board/superintendent relationships, operational effectiveness, and community partnerships. Conflicted members are asked to abstain on the recommendation coded 3.D.2. Approval shall be based on majority vote of the full membership.

d. Glassboro's 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Dyslexia Conference is scheduled for August 29<sup>th</sup> at GHS. Dr. Peter Bowers is the keynote speaker and will be focusing on helping educators improve literacy instruction through "structured word inquiry." See our district website for additional information.

### 3. **Board Committee Reports/Action Items**

### a. Instruction (Ms. Volz, Chair)

- Early Childhood grant submission for the 2019-2020 school year at \$717,664. We are proposing an adjustment to the original plan and will be offering 5 full day pre-K4 classes serving 90 students and 1 half-day pre-K3 class serving 30 students. If our proposal is approved, we will add an addition pre-K class serving 15 students.
- Acceptance of the School Improvement Grant Program (SIG) Cohort 4/4R-Year 4 of 5 from the New Jersey Department of Education in the amount of \$390,721.00.
- Recommending approval of the Memorandum of Understanding between Rowan University College of Education and Glassboro Public Schools for the 2019-2020 school year in support of PDS. BOE is waiting on issuance of 2018-2019 annual report.

### b. Operations (Mr. Esgro, Chair)

- The district is still pending a response from the Department of Education on our Emergency Aid request in the amount of \$1.6 million.
- Recommending approval to replace the Bowe School Sign through the generous donation of the Bowe PTO in the amount of \$4,800. The district will contribute \$1,000 from current expense budget.
- Recommend approval of the MOU with Glassboro Child Development Center to offer inschool afterschool program for the 2019-2020 school year for up to 150 students from the Bullock and Bowe schools. The program will be administered at the Bullock School.




