Good evening and thank you for your participation. During tonight's meeting, the board of education and community will be provided with a report from Mr. George Weeks, Director of Technology.

Since the start of the school year, we have experienced connectivity issues, delays in the implementation the LMS, system upgrades locking out students, and a myriad of other challenges associated with the distance learning. Last month we all heard about the promise of the Glassboro Virtual Academy and how it would serve to connect with the maximum number of students in a rigorous learning platform. Thus far, I am disappointed in its rollout and hope to hear some answers this evening.

I applaud the ongoing efforts of instructional staff who are going above and beyond to support teaching and learning during this difficult time. They are the conduits between the student and parents and the board and administration. I feel as though they have been asked them to go into battle each day without the proper equipment, resources or support to be effective. Yet they

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continue to work diligently through the difficulties, serve as the sounding board of complaints, primary communicator, and apologetic victim of the districts struggles to get it right.

Over the past month, I have witnessed supportive parents move their children to private or parochial schools in order to ensure their children are fully engaged in teaching and learning or otherwise ensure they are attended to throughout the day. While deciding on a child's education resides with the parents, my hope is that we can one day restore their confidence in the Glassboro School District.

The CSA will talk about the survey that was taken after the first week of school regarding lessons, connectivity, resolution of issues, and other matters. It was great that we appeared to have a high response rate (470 families), with satisfaction in the 70th percentile – which in my book equates to a grade of "C."

Of major concern in the way challenges are not being communicate nor being swiftly addressed. I deeply appreciate the calls and emails from parents and other stakeholders who are experiencing issues. However, my disappointment resides in the fact that the members of the board of education are not being promptly apprised of the challenges, the impact in instructions, and how those challenges are being addressed prior to hearing it from parents.

I challenge the central office and building level administrators to manage by walking around, meeting with the teachers, observing the challenges firsthand, and working collectively to get them addressed in a timely manner.

We are entrusted with the education of the children of Glassboro. We must do a better job. I will not accept anything less, nor should the citizens of Glassboro. Thank you!
