SECTION 2

1. Glassboro Public Schools has experienced an increase in students requiring intensive mental health and behavioral support. The district currently has four students placed in out-of-district programs with Emotional Regulation Impairment (ERI) classifications and one student pending placement. During the 2024–2025 school year, five students transferred into the district with existing placements in self-contained behavioral disabilities classrooms. An additional seven classified students required placement in the district's Alternative Evening School program due to an inability to succeed in the traditional school setting. These trends indicate a critical need for a structured and therapeutic in-district program to support students struggling with emotional and behavioral regulation.

The proposed program will directly address these unmet needs by offering a specialized educational setting within the students' home district that integrates academic instruction, therapeutic services, and social-emotional development.

- 2. Glassboro Middle School Emotional Regulation Support class:
 - a. Grades: 6th through 8th
 Age Range: Approximately 11–14 years old
 Estimated Number of Students: 8–12 students annually, depending on identified need and IEP team determinations. Program will initially begin with two or three students already enrolled in Glassboro Middle School
 - b. All instruction will align with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards. Students will receive instruction using the same curriculum materials as their grade-level peers. Content will be modified and differentiated in accordance with individual IEPs. The students will participate in all district-level assessments, including NJSLA standardized assessments and District benchmarking. Social Emotional Learning (SEL) objectives are embedded throughout the program through targeted instruction, group work, and counseling sessions.
 - c. The program ensures students are educated in the least restrictive environment through various opportunities for inclusion as students gain self regulation skills and tools to support them in a less restrictive environment. The program would be housed at the high school rather than in an out-of-district school. Student will have opportunities to be included in the middle school environment based on their progress. Opportunities to return to the middle school through provided transportation to attend appropriate classes to support the eventual full transition

- back into the middle school setting will be provided as individually appropriate for each student. Students will also have full access to general education extracurricular activities, assemblies, and elective offerings as appropriate.
- d. Students in the Emotional Regulation Support Class will have access to Middle School extracurricular activities (sports, clubs, events) as well as School-wide activities via transportation or walking trips to the Middle School
- e. The middle school program would be supported by one full time Special Education teacher, at least two paraprofessionals and a part time Child Study Team case manager (Psychologist or Social Worker) to support counseling throughout the day.
