Mark,

May I have your support for an application I'm submitting for a project grant from the New Jersey Historical Commission? Pursuant to new state requirements that New Jersey history be taught in our schools, the commission is soliciting projects to develop curricular materials on state and local history, particularly lessons and lesson plans that link New Jersey history to national history.

I am proposing a one-week unit on Glassboro history for 7th or 8th graders that includes four lessons of approximately 45 minutes each plus a two-hour guided school-bus tour of historic sites in the borough on the fifth day. Funds would cover the production and publication of lesson plans in electronic form as well as in print so that they might be used repeatedly by any number of teachers over the years. There may also be sufficient funding to cover the cost of the bus driver in the pilot year. With your recommendation, I would be pleased to consult with your staff in developing these lessons if you wish. To supplement the lessons, I have a number of brochures, monographs, scripts, lectures, a slide show, and a video on Glassboro history that I have written and presented over the past 15 years for other venues which I would be happy to donate to the school district.

As a forty-year resident of this historically important borough and a descendant of early New Jersey settlers, I have a particular interest in Glassboro history. The commission has twice previously recognized that interest by funding two earlier grants on the subject; moreover, I have consulted on three other history grants as well as a number of related projects on Glassboro history. Further, as a retired university instructor, a former school board member, and the mother of five children educated K-12 in Glassboro Public Schools, I have some knowledge of what might be interesting and appropriate for our students. Although Glassboro history has been taught sporadically by interested teachers in prior years, the district would be well served by a compact set of materials that could be filed and used regularly by any staff member; however, your support would not obligate you or your staff to accept the materials or to use them as proposed.

Would you be so kind as to write a brief letter of support for this application? For your convenience, I'm attaching my c.v., but the information in this email should suffice. Unfortunately, I would need the letter in electronic form by Friday afternoon because the application deadline is Monday, Jan. 12.
