Report of Activities Accomplished:

1. School garden care, planting, weeding, insect control, picking – Green Team members came in over the summer to care for garden as well
2. Implementation and incorporation of grant funds – students built a Rubbermaid shed that was bought with grant funds, built a shelving unit to house our plants in the winter including grow lights
3. Promoting recycling efforts throughout the school
4. We are working on a proposal to eliminate waste in the cafeteria including Styrofoam trays
5. Development of a school pledge to reduce, reuse and recycle as part of a school-wide initiative to go green
6. Community Cleanup – 4/28/18 on Ellis Mill Rd.
7. Walked to bullock school 3/12 to see the school garden and meet with horticulturist Brie Arthur
8. Acting as role-models of how to live sustainably and be responsible citizens
9. Maintenance of GIS Green Project Instagram page to bring awareness of our activities to other students and the community @gisgreenproject

Planned Activities for 2018-2019: meeting dates (i.e. day of week, time), how often (i.e. how many times); each club is encouraged to perform GHS community service improvement projects (i.e. weeding courtyards, flowerbeds, polishing plaques / trophies, updating the marquee sign / message board).

GIS Green Team will plan to meet bi-monthly on Mondays from 2:00-3:00.

Planned activities include care, maintenance and expansion of school garden, bi-yearly community cleanups as well as other going green initiatives in the school including reducing waste in the lunchroom. Painting going green slogans around the school including cafeteria.
