Had to email that art dept. and registrar about the change.

Received the last 2 supply orders for Rowan classes. Created purchase orders and handed in to Jenn.

January 24- Presented information on the Fine Art Academy and Rowan partnership at The Board Of Education meeting at night.

Received and reviewed in district applications.

Started talking with all students eligible to take Rowan Classes. Began looking at the fall courses and selecting courses.
