Discipline at Bowe Middle School November 2022

Summary:

The bulk of the suspensions for the month of November are for physical altercations as well as "Gross Disrespect" to staff. All of the altercations in November occurred in the hallways. We do believe that one of our hallways being shut down because of construction as well as the narrowness of our "elementary-sized" hallways attributes to the crowdedness which often leads to pushing/shoving/horseplay that escalates into altercations. It cannot be denied that we are also seeing a lack of social skills that is a result of COVID-19 and the pandemic. Some of our students seem to act first and think later. The majority of our physical altercations start with horseplaying and then take a turn for the worse where punches are thrown. Despite good relationships with most of our parents, there are still some that reiterate to their children that if anyone lays a hand on them, they should hit back/"defend themselves". Mr. Stephenson and I met with every PE class in the month of September and went through our expectations and consequences if behavioral expectations were not followed. At the end of the day, we are adhering to our code of conduct and not tolerating disrespect to each other and staff members as well as any form of physical harm.

Measures we have implemented:

- Upon return from OSS for a physical altercation, a meeting with the parent, student, and principal is held. Discussion of the severity of the consequence of a second such infraction is emphasized. Additional requirements upon return are shared:
 - NEW as of Dr. Light's return from maternity leave: Students are now required to participate in restorative counseling with Dr. Light. This program requires students who engaged in an altercation to participate in counseling together to work through their conflict and develop more productive strategies for managing conflict.
 - Also NEW, students are also required to sign up for small group (specifically, "In Control") with Dr. Light, focusing on self-control strategies.

Upcoming changes that will help:

- We are looking forward to the completion of construction in the science lab section of the building which will reduce some of the traffic flow through the media center as the loop around the 6th Grade wing will open up.
- Mr. Stephenson has an appointment scheduled with the SmartPass app group on December 15th. This will help us track students' patterns during the course of the day. It will be most effective if we can hire a security aide to monitor it. See below....

Additional supports needed:

- We need to secure at least one security aide for Bowe School. Until just now, we haven't had any applicants for the position. I believe the compensation is severely limiting who

might be interested. I have interviewed one candidate recently and we have another interview this week. In the perfect world, we would return to two as was the case at GIS, but we would be pleased to at least have one reliable security aide/hallway monitor ASAP. I am hopeful I am able to secure one (whose references check out) through this interview process.

- We need to fill the open positions at Bowe, including an additional floater sub that has never been filled, as we have been forced to assign coverages to teachers at a rate beyond which is ideal.
- Additional mental health & wellness services for our students many of whom (along with their families) are struggling mightily post-Covid.
- Additional placement options for students who continue to struggle to adhere to our expectations at the middle school level. Middle school students are at a difficult time in their lives and bumps in the road are to be expected. For the small handful of students who continue to struggle to successfully follow our guidelines despite the supports we do have in place, it is helpful to have an alternative option. For some, the reality of an alternative option is enough to get them on track.

We appreciate the continued support of the Board Office and the Board of Education in our efforts to make the Bowe Middle School what it is and can be.

Subject: Suspension Narrative - November

Hi Mary:

Here is a summary of the 11 suspensions from November:

November was a month that we experienced an uptick in suspensions at GHS. There had been an ongoing student conflict between females in the freshman class that we had been closely monitoring with no-contact agreements and frequent check-ins with students, administration and guidance. The conflict unfortunately escalated into a confirmed HIB, which resulted in 2 out-of-school suspensions for Violating the Rights of Others. We also had another founded HIB in which a student made inappropriate jokes about another student's sexuality (the offender had just returned from AEHS within that week).

In another isolated instance, a student walked out of the building during lunch without permission when he was upset, causing us to use all of our administrative resources to search for him.

There were three instances of unwanted physical contact/fighting, where two boys who claim to be friends went too far with inappropriate touching and pushing in the hallway, another student put his hands on someone else in the hallway, as well as a physical altercation in the cafeteria between two females over apparent gossip that was spreading.

We had two incidents that involved possession of cigarettes/lighters.
