He has completed all of his core academic requirements in the School Counseling graduate program and is scheduled to complete his 300-hour clinical internship in the fall 2022 semester beginning August 29, 2022. Mr. Davenport is seeking placement in the **Glassboro School District at the elementary level.**

The Master of Education program in school counseling is state approved by the Delaware Department of Education.
